We will be in Pennsylvania for all of our meetings; all of them only a few hours of travel. September Update:

I do apologize for the delay of sending out our regular prayer letter. While after the birth, mother and baby appeared fine, Simeon was jaundiced pretty severely, so that we had to stay in the hospital for three days, and then take him back to the hospital to be readmitted a day after being released. After phototherapy, we are praising the Lord that this issue is under control now. We had some other issues regarding his growth and weight, but again, praise God that these seem to have normalized. We also had some issues with Lena's health. During the delivery, her blood pressure started to rise. We rejoice that it was not preeclampsia, but it was still a grave health issue. About a week after birth, she had to go into the ER for postnatal hypertension. The doctor's put her on medicine, and it is now under control. We expect her to be weaned off of that at the six-week doctor's check-up. We have had other issues with Simeon feeding properly, but we seem to have come to a resolution on that front. All-in-all, September has been a stressful month, but God is good, and all of our hospital bills should be covered by insurance! Praise God! Thank you for your patience with me in getting out our prayer letter; we know the importance of prayer and keeping you updated on the things we need prayer for.
